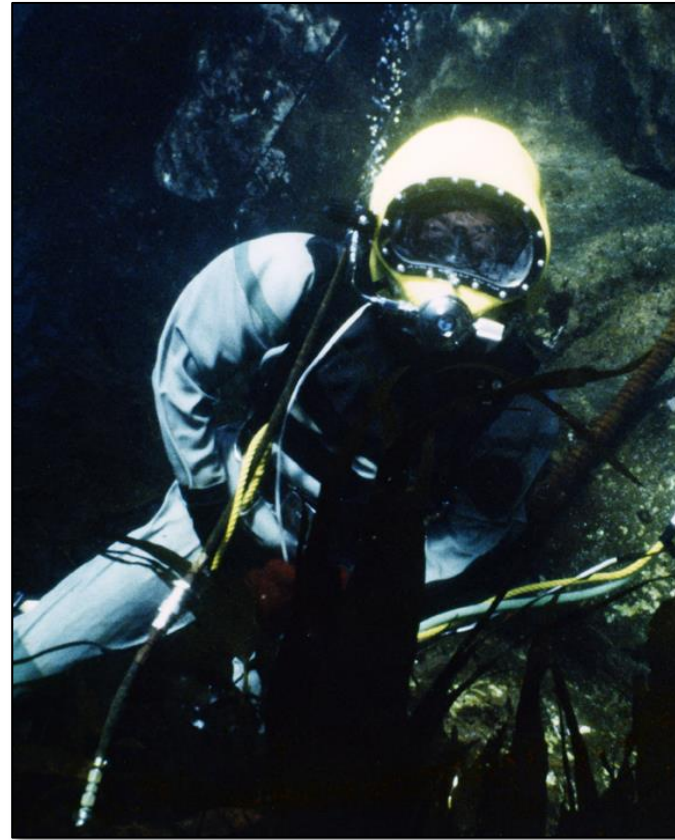

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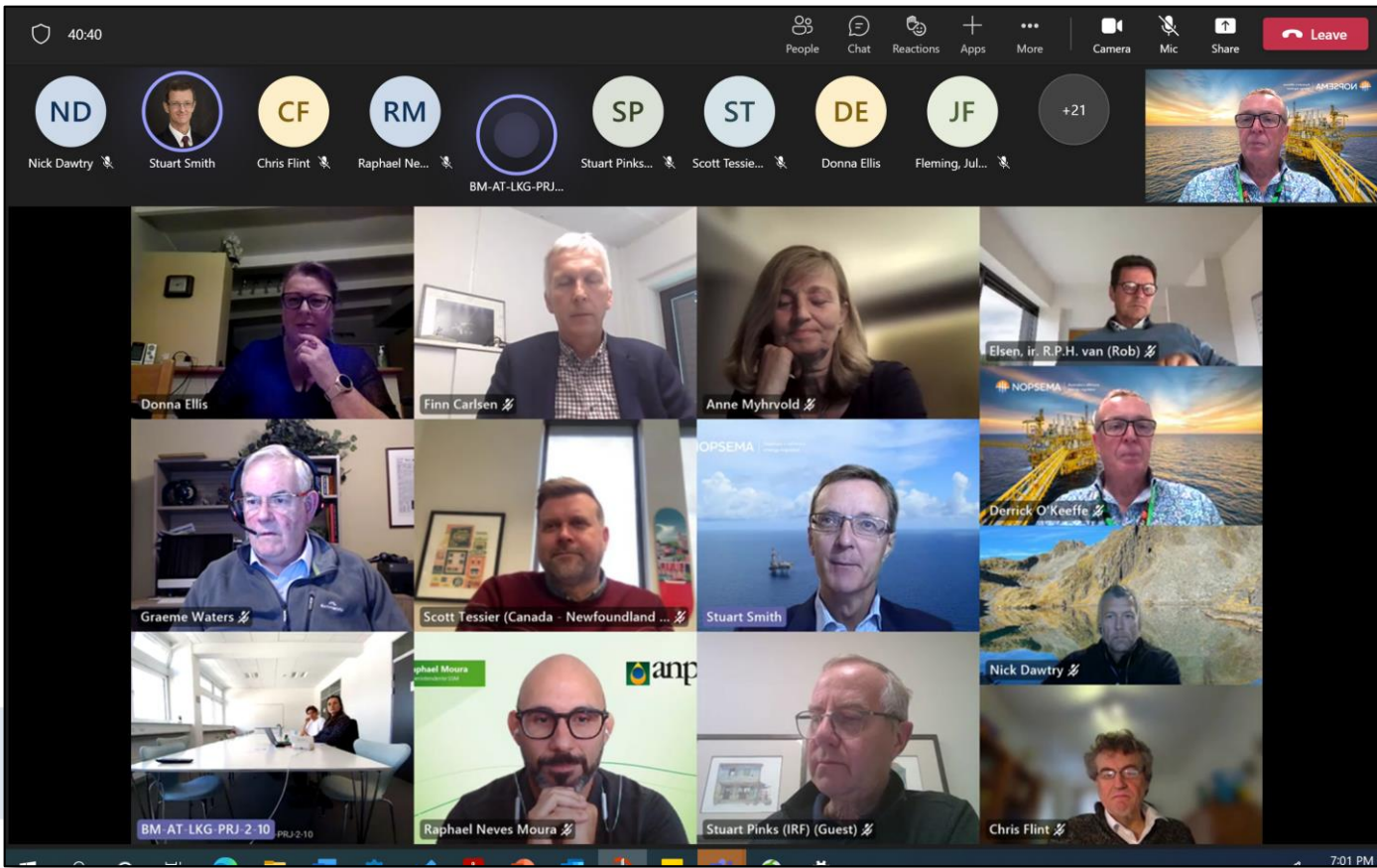

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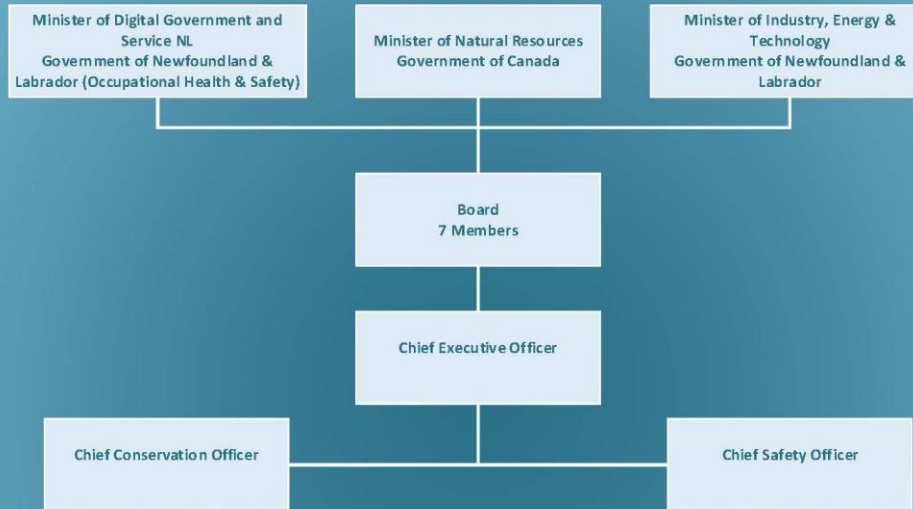


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## ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

# ADMINISTRATIVE MONETARY PENALTIES

Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs) are fines or penalties that can be imposed by the C-NLOPB in relation to incidences of non-compliance with legislation, regulations, permits, licences, certificate conditions, or decisions or orders. AMPs are intended to be a remedial compliance measure (regulatory), as opposed to a punitive measure (criminal).

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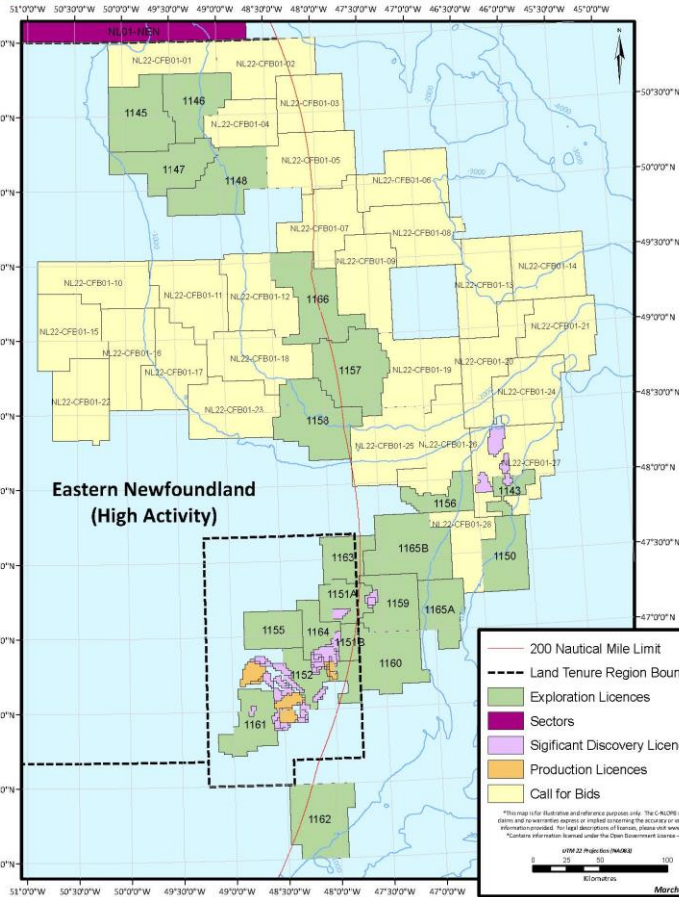


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## Call for Bids - NL22-CFB01 Eastern Newfoundland Region

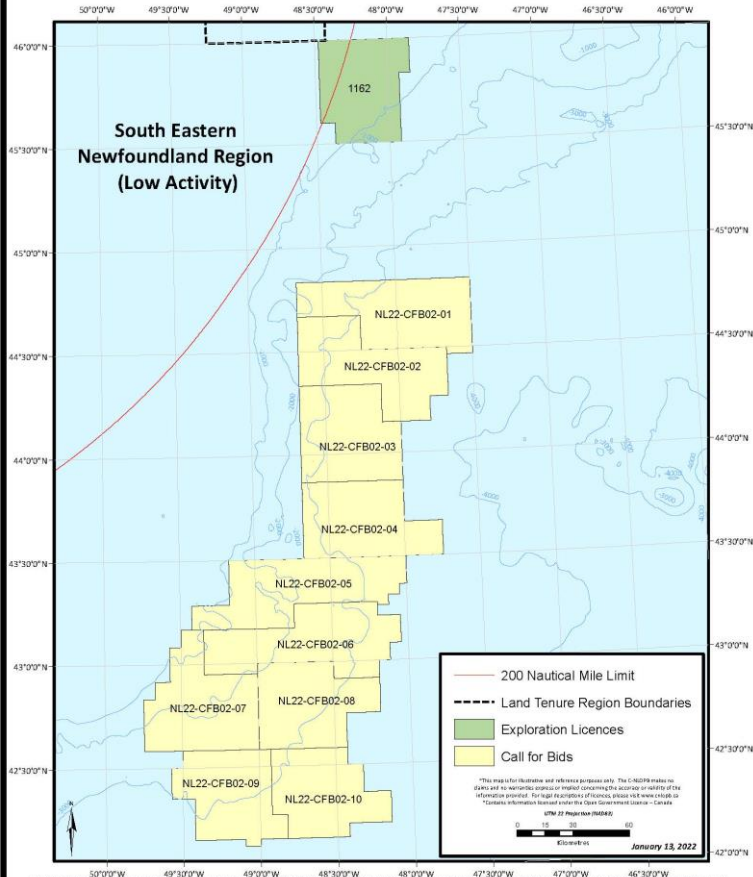

Any use of an area depicted on this map beyond 200 nautical miles off the coast of Newfoundland and Labrador is not intended by the Board to reflect the full extent of Canada's continental shelf beyond 200 nautical miles. Canada has filed a submission regarding the limits of the Outer Continental Shelf to the United Nations Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf in accordance with the provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea. The boundaries of waters, sectors or licences in areas beyond 200 nautical miles may be revised to reflect the limits of the Outer Continental Shelf established by Canada. All interest holders of production licences containing areas beyond 200 nautical miles may be required, through negotiation, registration, licence terms and conditions, or otherwise to make payment or contribute in order for Canada to fulfill obligations under Article 82 of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea.

**South Eastern Newfoundland Region**



Any land claim or interest reported on this map between 200 nautical miles off the coast of Newfoundland and Labrador is not reported by the Board to reflect the full extent of Canada's continental shelf beyond 200 nautical miles. Canada has filed a declaration regarding the limits of the Outer Continental Shelf in the Atlantic Ocean with the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf by the United Kingdom. Any other land claim based on a number or point of view in the Atlantic Ocean will be subject to approval by a International Seabed Authority. The boundaries of activity, search and interest in areas beyond 200 nautical miles may be revised to reflect the limits of the Outer Continental Shelf established by Canada. Attention is drawn to the fact that the Outer Continental Shelf extends beyond 200 nautical miles only for areas beyond 200 nautical miles. Exploration licence boundaries, as indicated, include areas of interest in areas beyond 200 nautical miles for areas beyond 200 nautical miles.
